January 15, 2018 – Candidates for the 3rd Antonio M. Gotto, Jr. Prize in Atherosclerosis Research

January 31, 2018 – IAS Visiting Fellowship Awards.

The International Atherosclerosis Society is very pleased to announce the **3rd Antonio M. Gotto, Jr. Prize in Atherosclerosis Research** which will be presented during the upcoming XVIII International Symposium on Atherosclerosis, June 9-12, 2018 in Toronto, Canada.

The Prize (\$ 20,000) is sponsored by Weill Cornell Medical College and the International Atherosclerosis Society.

The aim of the Gotto Prize is to encourage basic, clinical, and translational research in areas relating to the causes, prevention, and treatment of cardiovascular disease globally. The award recipient will have provided and continues to provide outstanding scientific, medical, or organizational advancement in our ability to understand the causes and to reduce the development of atherosclerosis.

Past winners of this prize have been: Helen H. Hobbs, MD (2012) and M. John Chapman, PhD, DSc. (2015).

We would greatly appreciate your proposals for possible winners. Please send a short letter (no more than one page) in support of your candidate to the Selection Committee for its consideration, to GottoPrize@athero.org by **Monday, January 15, 2018**.

The **IAS Visiting Fellowship Awards** are presented each year in an effort to develop skills that will not only impact favourably on the personal career of the winners but will also enhance clinical and research programs in their home country.
