



Alan Chait, MD, obtained his medical degree from the University of Cape Town, South Africa. After completing internship at Groote Schuur Hospital in Cape Town, he undertook additional clinical training at the Hammersmith Hospital in London, where he embarked on his research career in the area of lipid metabolism and atherosclerosis. He then went for further research training to the University of Washington, Seattle, USA, where he joined the faculty in 1977. After rising through the ranks, he is now the Edwin L. Bierman Professor of Medicine and head of the Division of Metabolism, Endocrinology and Nutrition in the Department of Medicine at the University of Washington. He also is director of the Clinical Nutrition Research Unit at that institution. His current research interests are in the area of cellular mechanisms of atherogenesis, with a particular emphasis on the roles of diabetes, lipoproteins and inflammation in the pathogenesis of atherosclerosis.
