



Dr Steiner is Professor Emeritus of Medicine at the University of Toronto and former Head of Endocrinology at the Toronto General Hospital. He obtained his MD from the University of British Columbia (Vancouver, Canada) and did his postgraduate training at McGill and at Harvard Universities. His work has been concerned primarily with the interface between diabetes and atherosclerosis. His research has extended from fundamental studies of triglyceride rich lipoprotein metabolism, through animal and human studies of lipoprotein kinetics to clinical trials. The clinical trials have ranged from the Lipid Research Clinics Primary Prevention Trial to the present Bypass Angioplasty Revascularization Investigation (BARI) 2 Diabetes Study.

He was the Project Director of the Diabetes Atherosclerosis Intervention Study (DAIS), a multinational intervention study that was the first specifically designed to examine the impact on coronary artery disease of correcting lipoprotein abnormalities in type 2 diabetes. In addition to his research, Dr. Steiner was Head of the WHO Collaborating Centre for the Study of Atherosclerosis in Diabetes and has participated in the development of Canadian guidelines for lipid intervention in diabetes.
