The faculty will include Dong Zhao (Epidemiology), Raul Santos (TG-rich lipoproteins), Peter Libby (Inflammation), Changtao Jiang (Microbiota and ceramide), Samia Mora (Lp(a)), Yida Tang (Obesity and Insulin Resistance).

As you read in my message last month, Khalid Al-Rasadi, Principal Investigator, and Frederick Raal, Co- Principal Investigator, have develop a survey "Acute Cardiac Complications of COVID19 in patients with Familial Hypercholesterolemia" to study the impact of COVID19 infection and acute cardiac complications in the MENA and Africa national or regional constituent societies.
